REACH Regulation 1907/2006/EC - Declaration of Conformity

REACH regulation of the European Union (EU) is adopted to improve the protection of human health and the environment from the risks that can be posed by chemicals. Cosel is fully aware of the REACH regulation and is working in close contact with its suppliers to ensure the requirements are met. Cosel is continuously monitoring updates in the REACH regulation as well as keeping track on changes that occur in the supply chain due to updated or new products.

Cosel's products are "articles" as defined in Chapter 2, Article 3 (3) of the REACH regulation and do not, according to our best knowledge, release substances under their normal use.

Suppliers of articles must provide recipients with information on SVHC (Substances of Very High Concern), defined in Article 57 and Annex XIV of the REACH regulation, if those are present above a concentration limit of 0,1% w/w on article level.

Cosel's products meet these limits while lead may be present in some components in a concentration above 0.1% w/w on component level, but are still RoHS compliant with lead (alloy) exemptions 6(c), 7(a) and 7(c)-I according RoHS2 regulation 2011/65/EU and 2015/863/EU 10/10, Annex III.

Registration is required for companies that either produce or import into the European Union any Substances of Very High Concern in volumes that exceed one metric tonne per year and substance. Cosel do not exceed this import amount and will therefore not be required to register.
